If you're looking for a funky place to have a drink on a Friday night, **Lindsay Wesker** plays at **Sylvan's**

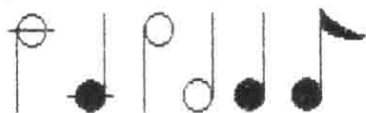

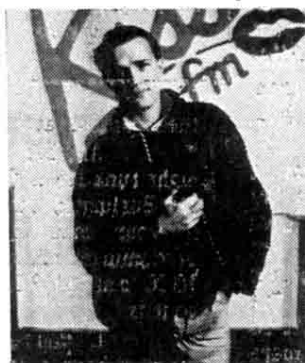
His replacement is the very competent **Tony**, whose voice is already familiar to you as maestro of The Word Team. He will be continuing to present the Word.
